**Week 2 - Next week our focus is – BE SAFE - Always move between classes in a quiet and orderly manner.**

Teachers will be reinforcing the routines that have been established for the quiet and orderly movement of students between classes. Students are expected to wait patiently in lines, sensibly behind one another, without pushing or raising voices.

**HEADLICE ALERT – CHECK HEADS TODAY!**

There have been a number of reports of head lice since the start of term. To help prevent the on-going problem of head lice it is most important that **all students have their hair checked and it is advised that other family members also have their hair checked. Keep checking every 2 days until there are no head lice found for 10 consecutive days.**

If you find head lice, commence effective treatment immediately and be sure to complete the process of treatment. This will prevent the head lice from spreading.

**Finding head lice – some helpful hints...**

*Many lice do not cause an itch, so you have to look carefully to find them.*

Head lice are found on the hair itself and move to the scalp to feed. They have six legs which end in a claw and they rarely fall from the head. Louse eggs (also called nits) are laid within 1.5 cm of the scalp and are firmly attached to the hair. They resemble dandruff, but can't be brushed off. Lice can crawl and hide. The easiest and most effective way to find them is to follow these steps:

Step 1 - Comb any type of hair conditioner on to dry, brushed (detangled) hair. This stuns the lice and makes it difficult for them to grip the hair or crawl around.

Step 2 - Now comb sections of the hair with a fine tooth, head lice comb.

Step 3 - Wipe the conditioner from the comb onto a paper towel or tissue.

Step 4 - Look on the tissue and on the comb for lice and eggs.

Step 5 - Repeat the combing for every part of the head at least four or five times

If lice or eggs are found, the hair should be treated.

If the person has been treated recently and you only find empty hatched eggs, you may not have to treat, as the empty eggs could be from a previous episode.
