Staff will be teaching students the importance of using polite language when at school. The teaching and reinforcing throughout the week will focus on students always talking with others with a respectful tone and to always use appropriate language.

TEACHERS AND PARENTS/CARERS WORKING TOGETHER – PART 2

One of the best ways that parents/carers can help their children succeed in school is to be involved with their education. This starts with communicating well with your child's teacher. Basically, good communication involves meeting with the teacher, being a positive and courteous partner in your child's learning, and keeping the lines of communication open in various ways throughout the year. Please see your teacher as the first line of communication if you have any concerns.

7. Be a partner with the teacher to support your child's learning. Thirty years of research shows that children do better in school when their parents are involved. Some of the most important things you can do are to:

- Help with homework as needed and appropriate.
- Help your child learn the skills needed to manage time and stay on task.
- Ask teachers for clarification on instructions and assignments as needed.
- Talk about school matters with your student at home.
- Ask teachers what you can do to help your child at home.

At the same time, as your children get older, teachers expect them to be able to take on more responsibility and to function independently. Your child likely will want more and more autonomy as well. Help them build these skills while also continuing to be supportive.

8. Keep the lines of communication open all year.

- Send a note of appreciation to the teacher when something goes well in her/his class, and mention this to the Principal.
- Ask what you can do to help with classroom activities, presentations or fairs, field trips, tuckshop, P&C matters, or anything you can do at home.
- Check the school and web sites such as the school page on Facebook to keep up with what is going on, in and out of the classroom.
