Week 10 - PBL (Positive Behaviour For Learning) Update

Our school has continued to demonstrate an improvement in the positive behaviour exhibited by our students. Data that has been collected over a number of years clearly shows that the incidence of office referrals has decreased every year. This improvement can be directly attributed to the focused teaching and revisiting of rules each week, the acknowledgement by teachers of the positive behaviour that our students exhibit and by the positive choices that the students are making when dealing with problems or conflict.

Next semester, staff at the school will begin to be involved with the next stage of the PBL process known as Tier 2. They will undergo professional development in the Effective Classroom Practices Program. The training focuses on eight essential classroom management features which work together with school wide strategies to support student behaviour.
