Year 10 Science a 'Force of Nature'

In Science this term we are studying Force and Motion. The Year 10's have been learning about Isaac Newton and his 'Laws of Motion'. The first Law refers to 'Inertia' and we now realize why it is important to 'buckle up'. Newton's third Law looks at 'Actions and Reactions' and why everything we do has a consequence. Newton's second Law is mathematical and will be discussed after a week of Athletics and the University Camp. The students have been busy learning about the equations for speed, velocity, acceleration and deceleration. They have played with Newton's Cradle, ticker tapes, toy cars and digital robots pushing boxes on ice. We look forward to getting into some more speed with mass and force and looking at motion detection.
