This week's PBL focus is – BE SAFE - Enter the school grounds between 8.30 and 8.50 a.m.

Teachers and teacher-aides are busy organising their day before school and they are not rostered on to any playground duty during this time before the first bell. In order to assure their safety, children are not to enter the school grounds earlier than 8.30 without special permission. Children of teachers are to wait in their parent's classroom until the 8:30am bell is rung. If students arrive earlier than 8.30 we ask that they wait quietly and in an orderly fashion outside the school grounds until the 8.30 bell.

If students arrive after the 8.50 bell they are required to go straight to the office and obtain a late-slip to hand to their form teacher.
