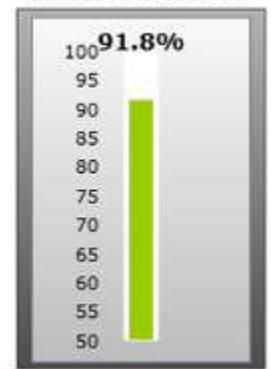
### Attendance Week 1 Term 2
