Chappy Chatter with Chappy Jason

What does Chappy Jason do at school? (Part 1)

A School Chaplain provides social, emotional and spiritual support to the school community by providing a friendly, caring and supportive role model to young people. Chaplains provide a listening ear and caring presence for young people in times of need and those who just need a friend. They can help students find a better way to deal with issues, ranging from family breakdown and loneliness to stress and anxiety. Chaplains are approachable as they are seen as less intimidating than traditional authority figures. This hopefully allows them to be made aware of situations before they reach crisis point. A Chaplain's role is to provide a trusting relationship and a non-judgemental, understanding environment for young people that allow them to freely express their issues and beliefs.

Chaplains are trained and work in partnership with other caring professionals, both in and out of school. Chaplains work in partnership with the schools Guidance Officer and learning support team and can refer on to other caring professionals through the school principal. All school chaplains hold qualifications in youth work, community work or other relevant disciplines, to at least a Diploma level under a nationally recognised standard. Most school chaplains exceed that and many hold higher-level degree qualifications. Feel free to contact Chappy Jason at anytime.
