### MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINATION PROGRAM FOR YOUNG PEOPLE AGED 15 TO 19 YEARS

The Meningococcal vaccination program offered to Year 10 students in school is also open to all young people aged 15 to 19 years. All Year 10 students are offered free meningococcal ACWY vaccination through the Qld School Immunisation Program. If you are not in year 10 but are between the ages of 15 to 19 years you are eligible to get this vaccine from your local Doctor.

**Vaccines via your GP / Dr—Meningococcal vaccination for 15—19 year olds -**

**Meningococcal ACWY - One dose of Meningococcal ACWY offered to all 15 to 19 year olds**

*Meningococcal disease is a rare but severe infection that occurs when meningococcal bacteria invade the body from the throat or nose. Worldwide, the main strains that cause meningococcal disease are A, B, C, W and Y. As there is a safe and effective vaccine that covers strains A, C, W and Y, the Meningococcal ACWY Vaccination Program is being introduced in 2017.*

***This vaccine is also available free for young people aged 15 to 19 years of age through their local doctor. While the vaccine is provided free by the Qld Government, the doctor may charge a consultation fee.***
