### Chappy Chatter with Chappy Jason

Over the last few editions I have shared some of my thoughts on how to connect with young people. I previously mentioned our story and how we can use our life and experiences to draw on and connect with young people. In my own personal story, I grew up in a family where undiagnosed Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) was the main influence on life. My father, a returned serviceman, was struggling to deal with the remnants of his war service and the stresses of his work life. He regularly awoke during the night yelling, screaming and fighting as he relived the war in his nightmares. This often made him highly stressed, short tempered and edgy. As a young person growing up in this environment it was not always fun and definitely not something I would volunteer for a second time. But so what? This experience helps me find commonality and connections with young people, especially those with difficult circumstances in their past, because I understand some of what they are feeling and going through. What experiences in your life have created opportunity for you to share and connect with the young people around you?
